Help Haiti - Want to do more than send a check to help our brothers and sisters in Haiti? The Cathedral Square Neighborhood in response to the Haitian disaster is sponsoring a Drop Off Site for hygiene kits needed by Church World Service. The site is Park Central Church or you can bring to St. Paul's and we will get them to the site.

Hygiene Kit includes: one hand towel (16x28"), one wash cloth, one wide-tooth comb, one nail clipper (no files/emery boards), one bar soap (bath size in wrapper), one tooth brush (in original wrapper), Six Band-Aids, (no tooth paste, this will be added by CWS), place in one-gallon plastic bag with zipper. Value \$10/ \$2 shipping cost. Thank you for providing some needed help to those who so desperately need it. Thanks, Canon Jane.

B&G Meeting, February 1, 2010 - Completed projects -- these are done, the Robing Room and West Stairwell roof leak repairs, and the Bishop's Office ice dam heat tape. The Deanery window replacement requires Historic Preservation approval before proceeding. Committee discussed spending policies for the Reifenstein Fund, and made a list of previously approved "leak" projects and other major maintenance projects; John will seek contractors' bids, then recommendations will be made to the Finance Committee and Vestry for review and approval. Lighting Conservation Project -- we have inventoried the light fixtures, and will prepare a project description. Bishop's archives -- the floor is sufficiently strong to support the archive materials, and the Bishop's staff will do the moving. Building Security -- no single person is responsible for locking up after evening events. B&G recommends either rehiring a paid live-in sextant (for which we do not have any budgeted salary), or giving a renter reduced rent in exchange for doing locking-up. Full text of the minutes are posted on the kiosk at the rear of the cathedral.

LENT'S LOSS, EASTER'S GAIN

(From the Cross to the Empty Tomb)

This is a six-week Lenten series led by Dr. Richard Pilgrim, Professor Emeritus of Religion (SU) featuring guided readings and discussions appropriate to the season (symbols of death and denial, symbols of renewal and resurrection, and the spiritual disciplines that may well play a part). Here are some “teasers” that will give you the idea:

- “If any want to become my disciples, let them deny themselves and take up their cross and follow me. For those who want to save their life will lose it, and those who lose their life for my sake...will save it.” Mark 8:34f.
- “If anyone is in Christ, there is a new creation: everything old had passed away; see, everything has become new!” 2nd Corinthians 5:17
- “For his sake I have suffered the loss of all things ... in order that I gain Christ.” Philippians 3:8

The series will run from Sunday, February 21 through Sunday, March 28 from 11:45 AM– 12:30 PM in the Dining Room at St. Paul’s Cathedral. All are welcome.

Each Sunday will feature a selection from the day’s Lectionary as a starting point for our discussion. For example, on Sunday, Feb. 21 we will read Luke 4:1-13; on Feb. 28, Phil.3:17-4:1; on March 7, Exodus 3:1-15; on March 14, 2nd Cor. 5:16-21 + Luke 15:11b-32; on March 21, Phil. 3:4b-14; and on March 28, Phil. 2:5-11.
